# SEA SERVICE EXPLANATION

Time is documented by *days*. One day equals 4+ hours on the water Time is valid on any registered or documented vessel after the age of 16

#### **OUPV**

OPERATOR OF UNINSPECTED PASSENGER VESSELS (Six Pack)
This license allows you to take 6 or less passengers on *uninspected* vessels (sail included) up to 100 Gross Tons on waters qualified -Near Coastal or Inland

- 360 days experience on Inland waters
- 90 days of which was within last 3 years (recency clause)
- To obtain a Great Lakes endorsement: 90 days service on the Great Lakes
- To obtain a Mate Near Coastal: 90 Days service on Near Coastal applicable waters
- To obtain an OUPV near coastal: 90 days on Near Coastal applicable waters

#### **NATIONAL MASTER**

National Master Licenses allow you to take an unlimited number of passengers on *inspected* vessels of **25**, **50**, **or 100 Gross Ton** increments on waters (routes) specified - Inland or NC

- 360 Days experience on inland waters
- 90 Days within last 3 years (recency clause) on appropriate tonnage see GRT explanation
- To obtain Great Lakes endorsement: 90 days of service on Great Lakes
- To obtain a Near Coastal Route: 720 days total of which 360 days are on NC/Ocean/GL
- To obtain Sail endorsement: minimum of 180 days on sailing vessel 360 days for Master Near Coastal

#### **GRT Tonnage Calculations**

You will be issued a Masters License for **25**, **50 or 100** Gross Tons. To determine what you are eligible for, you will first need to calculate the vessels Gross Tons, then apply time using the table below. Gross Tonnage forms may be downloaded from our web site. Documented vessels list their Gross Tonnage and that value must be used. The following table is an explanation of service requirements for a Master License.

#### MASTER INLAND (total 360 days on Inland waters)

- 100 GRT 90 days on vessels 51 GRT or above or 180 days on vessels 34 GRT or above
- 50 GRT 90 days on vessels 25 GRT or above or 180 days on vessels 17 GRT or above
- 25 GRT If mariner does not meet tonnage for 50 GRT then a 25 GRT will be issued

#### MASTER NEAR COASTAL (total 720 days with 360 days on NC, Oceans or Great Lakes)

- 100 GRT 180 days on vessels 51 GRT or above or 360 days on vessels 34 GRT or above
- 50 GRT 180 days on vessels 26 GRT or above or 360 days on vessels 17 GRT or above
- 25 GRT If mariner does not meet tonnage for 50 GRT then a 25 GRT will be issued

#### **TONNAGE UPGRADES (Increase in scope)**

Tonnage upgrades will be issued using the above criteria, however:

 25 to 50 or 50 to 100 Master Inland or Near Coastal, 90 days since issuance on any size vessel!

#### **INLAND TO NEAR COASTAL UPGRADE (Raise of grade)**

• Time on NC waters as discussed above apply although applicant may need additional examination or completion of approved class for raising grade from Inland to Near Coastal. It is advisable to intially apply for a Mate Near Coastal (90 days NC) to avoid further testing.

#### The Small Vessel Sea Service Form (CG-719S)

The sample shown is available on our web site (Resources). It is used only for vessels less than 200 GRT. Time on larger vessels must be submitted by a letter with all the pertinent information the form requires. Vessels greater than 300 GRT will be considered only upon review. Use only 1 vessel per form. Multiple forms may be used for the same vessel on which you have more than 5 years of sea time.

#### **Physicals:**

The Application for Medical Certificate (CG 719K) is available on the website (Resources). If you use your own physician, be sure they fill in this form carefully and completely!

#### **Drug Test:**

Applicants must be in a random program or take a **5 panel DOT test by a SAMSHA approved lab** within 6 months of application date. Results need to be scanned as a .pdf and submitted within your application file.

## **Application Check List**

Use this check list to assure that all your ducks are in a row! All CG forms are available on the website under "Resources". It will link you to the NMC website - scroll down for the appropriate form. Once assembled, you will need to scan all the documents as .pdf files. These will be emailed to your nearest REC (locations available on website under Resources). The subject line should have your name, and SS # . Your Application Form (CG-719K) must be notarized (oath) in person and signed / dated before scanning.

Save hard copies of everything for future reference! If you are near an REC office, you may submit your file in person by appointment.
